Apply online: https://www.pfew.org/pfew-company-advisor. After registering, you'll receive details via email. All Advisors must complete a background check and child abuse clearances, FBI fingerprinting (if not a 10-year PA resident), and state-mandated reporter training (certificate required).

If an emergency arises, you are required to help identify a suitable replacement for your position.
